

The Linn Dara School Education Day Programme is a short term programme focused on supporting young people in 1st – 6th year in Secondary School. The Education Day programme accepts CAMHS referrals for young people from the Linn Dara CH07 area.

This programme offers a short term intervention of approximately 8 weeks with a view and objective of the young person returning to school. Linn Dara School will support with this return to mainstream education.

There are options to attend 5 days a week or attend both their own school and the Linn Dara School Education Day Programme.

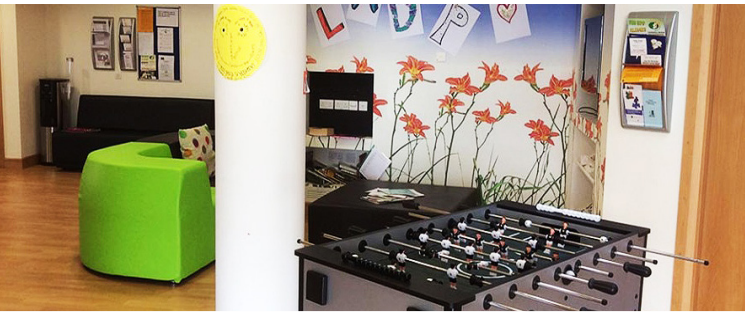
LINN DARA SCHOOL EDUCATION DAY PROGRAMME

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Young people will be supported in Junior Cycle and Senior Cycle Curricula by qualified, experienced post primary teachers in a wide range of subjects including **Irish, English, Maths, History, Geography, Science, Business, French, Art, Woodwork, Wellbeing, Physical Education, Social, Personal and Health Education (SPHE) and Civic, Social and Political Education (CSPE).**

Support will be also offered in other curricular areas, where possible: **Cooking, Horticulture, Career Guidance and School Excursions also form part of the programme offered.**

Throughout enrolment, we will liaise with parents and the nominated CAMHS key worker and provide regular updates on progress. A Student Support File will be developed and regular communication links will be initiated and maintained with home schools. A phased return will be developed.

- Support for return to school

Referrals are taken on an ongoing basis.

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
